

William Jarocki

Since 1996, **William Jarocki** has been the Director of the Environmental Finance Center located at Boise State University. He also serves as an adjunct faculty member in the Master of Public Administration Program and the College of Engineering. The Environmental Finance Center specializes in the financial and management aspects of water and wastewater systems.

Jarocki has led the development of the Center's financing tools including Plan2Fund, CAPFinance, RateCheckup, Ratio8, and the Directory of Watershed Resources Interactive Database. In 1995 and 1996, he directed Idaho's Drinking Water Protection Program as the Interim Program Manager, overseeing the technical and policy aspects of the state's primacy program. Prior to joining the Department of Environmental Quality, Jarocki served on the staff of the Association of Idaho Cities and was the AIC Executive Director from 1989 to 1992.

He is a member of the American Water Works Association's Finance, Accounting, and Management Controls Committee and the former chairman of AWWA-Pacific Northwest Chapter's Financial Management Committee. He received two National Performance Review Awards for his work in small communities regarding implementation of environmental and community priorities. Jarocki earned a bachelor's degree from Northwestern University and a master's degree in public administration from Boise State University.
